### **State Spelling Bee Participation:**

Any youth from the Church of God in Christ can compete on the State level. The competition starts the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of the Youth Convention the assigned rooms for the competition will be announced before the competition begins.



# **Spelling Bee Competition Rules**

- 1. The Spell master shall pronounce each word clearly to each contestant. The contestant will have to "say spell say" repeat the word then spell the word then repeat the word a second time. The contestant can ask the Spellmaster to put the word in a simple sentence or give a definition. (Note some words have more than one spelling or definition. If the word is spelled right, it will be accepted).
- 2. Having started to spell a word, a contestant shall be given <u>no opportunity</u> to change the letters once pronounced. A speller, having started to spell a word may retrace, providing the letters and their sequence are not changed in the retracing.
- 3. Upon missing the spelling of a word, the contestant drops out of the contest.
- 4. When the contestants are reduced to two, the elimination procedure changes. When one person misspells a word the next person must spell that word plus the next word to win. If one of the last two participants misspells a word, and the other person after correcting the error of the first person misses the next word given, the first can have the chance to spell that word, if spelled correctly then if the same person spells the next word right then that person wins. (You must spell two words right in a row to win.)
- 5. Any question during the contest must be referred to the judges immediately. No protest can be considered after a round has started.

Jurisdictional Oratorical Competition consists of three (3) categories:

Pre-teens Category (Ages 7-11) Time Allowed: 2-3 minutes Junior Category (Ages 12-15) Time Allowed: 3-5 minutes Senior Category (Ages 16-19) Time Allowed: 5-7 minutes College Category (Ages 20-22) Time Allowed: 7-10 minutes Adult Category (Ages 23 and Older) Time Allowed: 7-10 minutes

Jurisdictional contestants must submit an entry form to the coordinator. Applicants must be members of the Church of God In Christ and must be prepared to show proof of age if requested.

### **Information about Oratory:**

The characteristics of oratory that distinguishes it from public speaking, in general is that it appeals to the emotions. No matter how clear, logical or effective speaking may be, as long as it appeals primarily to the intellect, it remains public speaking.

When, however, emotions are touched – love, joy, hate, ambition- then speaking becomes oratory. And although oratory appeals powerfully to the emotions of the hearer, yet it is not necessarily preaching.

Oratory is composed of two elements: matter and manner. When one gives an oration, one should be certain of the content and substance of his/her oration. Orations must be original and done from memory. You MAY NOT read verbatim; however, notes MAY BE used. The time limit is 2-10 minutes depending on your age-group category.

\*PLEASE NOTE: In the national oratorical competition, you will not be able to use any notes.

Part 1: Participants will be given writing prompt. Each participant must choose their stance and defend their case with at least reasons.


Your creative paper must include:

- 2. Body Write three reasons why you hold the position you have taken on. Elaborate on those three reasons.
- 3. Conclusion Re-state the topic, state whether you are for or against school uniforms, and include a catching ending to conclude your creative writing paper.

Part 2: Freestyle. Each participant will be given an opportunity to write a play, song, poem, or any writing of their choosing, as accepted by the SMM Director.

### RULES:

- You will have [25] minutes to write your position paper.
- You will have [15] minutes to write your freestyle paper.
- Grammar, spelling, and punctuation *does* count!!!
- You *cannot* use your cell phone or receive *any* assistance while writing your paper.

### PRE-CONVENTION COMPUTER COMPETITION FOR GRADES 6TH-12TH

You have been named the journalist and creator for the Scholastic Motivation Ministries (SMM) Teen Newsletter. It is your job to gather info that would be interesting to youth. Please download the Pre-Convention Computer information below. You can get started now.



The Mathematics Olympiad is open to all youth in grades 3 through 12. Students with a strong background in mathematics are encouraged to participate. Calculators are not permitted in Level I and Level II competitions. Please note that Levels III, IV, and V participants are encouraged to bring and use their own calculators. All youth participating must enroll for the AIM Math Olympiad by the required deadline.

Each participant will be assigned to the appropriate age/grade level and category of the competition. Each round will be given an allotted time for the exercises. There will be a variety of mathematical exercises measuring basic operations in addition, subtraction, multiplication, division, fractions, and word problems. There is a special category for all levels of the competition for Biblical mathematics. All participants are encouraged to bring their Bibles. The Math Olympiad competition is conducted in five categories:

- Level I Grades 3 & 4
- Level II Grades 5 & 6
- Level III Grades 7 & 8
- *Level IV Grades 9 & 10*
- Level V Grades 11 & 12

Participants for the Olympiad should concentrate on grade level materials. There is also a Biblical component of the Math Olympiad. Here are some sample Biblical mathematic questions:

1. Who is the oldest man and woman who died in the Bible? 2. Who is the oldest man who was born in the Bible? 3. Who is the oldest man who died in the Bible? 4. How many times did the Army of Israel march around Jericho? 5. How long did the "Noah-Flood" last?


Practice tests are given on Tuesday and Wednesday. Students with the highest score in each category receive a calculator. On Thursday of AIM, the National Math Olympiad competition test is given. Students with the highest score win the International AIM Mathematics Olympiad Trophy for each category.

Pencils and scratch paper will be provided. An instructional board or flip-chart, and an overhead projector and screen will be utilized for pedagogical and illustrational purposes.

### INTRODUCTION

### Bible 2019 Books: Leviticus

This competition will be held during the academic ministries portion of the Youth Convention. The purpose of the Bible Bowl Competition is to provide the platform for the young people of the Church of God In Christ who have successfully won local and district championships to demonstrate their abilities in a state competition. Specifically, this competition will give district teams an opportunity to express their skills in communication, to express their ability to think reflectively and demonstrate their willingness to cooperate as a team member.

### ORGANIZATIONAL RULES AND PROCEDURES

This competition is open to Senior and Junior teams of each district Bible Bowl Competition.

### **AGES**

Senior Team members and Junior Team members must meet age requirements. They MUST have attained the age of 16-22 by the start of the Convention. Junior Team members must by ages 5-15 by the start of the Convention.

Adult Competition/Adult team members must be 23 or older.

### **TEAMS**


The Teams shall consist of two (2) to four (4) people all of which MUST complete in every round. A team may be ALL male or ALL female or mixed. A team may consist of people from one church, a district or a mixture of the Jurisdiction.

### **OFFICIALS**

There will be a Moderator, the person who will read all questions. There will two (2) judges, one of which will act as the timekeeper and one as the scorekeeper. The judges will have the final say on all Disputes.

### SCORING

Each correct answer will count for one (1) point for each incorrect answer, a point will be subtracted. The score from each round will be carried into the next round and totaled at the end of the third (3) round.

Level 4 – College Students (Freshman – Senior)


